III. General Studies Program Information:

Brief Program Description (from 2016-17 college catalog):

The Associate in Arts Degree in General Studies is designed for individuals who have yet to declare a major and are interested in exploring different programs, who are completing program prerequisites, or who are interested in the flexibility to create a customized degree program for which no other major exists. A general education core of courses in the program offers students the opportunity to develop skills in communication, the humanities, the social sciences, mathematics and science.

Twenty-seven additional credit hours selected from an advising pathway allows for the acquisition of further knowledge to enhance workplace skills, and/or to provide a broad spectrum of educational experiences to further develop academic, occupational, or personal aspirations.

In addition, the General Studies program may prepare students who plan to transfer to a four-year college or university in pursuit of a bachelor's degree. In order to ensure optimal transfer of credits to upper division programs, students should work collaboratively with their academic advisor and the Director of Placement and Transfer Services to plan a course of study that meets their goals. To facilitate the transfer of courses, students should identify, as soon as possible, the upper division program and institution in which they plan to enroll.

Program Educational Outcomes

Upon completion the graduate is prepared to:

1. Communicate clearly and effectively employ written and oral skills.
2. Access, analyze, summarize and interpret a variety of reading materials.
3. Think critically and link concepts across a variety of disciplines.
4. Conceptualize society as being culturally diverse within a global community.
5. Evaluate personal values, interests and education/career goals.

Strengths:

- General Studies remains the highest enrolled program at CMCC due to its flexibility. Students can tailor a degree to meet their needs if such a degree is not offered. Students can take courses while waiting to gain admission into a waitlisted program or a program that they have yet to meet prerequisites.
- General Studies students have a high-level of access to advisors. The students are advised by the Learning and Advising Center (LAC) representatives who are available Monday through Thursday from 8:00 a.m.- 7:00 p.m. and Fridays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The LAC representatives provide intrusive advising and serve as the model advising program to other departments on campus.
- The General Studies program has provided the College a pathway to explore potential new programs. For example, the Criminal Justice and Human Services programs morphed out of a trial period under the General Studies umbrella. The trial period gives the College time to explore course offerings and gauge student interest before establishing a new stand-alone program.
- Ten years ago the College recognized that the General Studies program was plagued with high attrition and low graduation rates and a high student to advisor ratio. In order to address these issues, a five-year Title III grant focused on retaining and transferring General Studies students. Out of the grant the LAC was born, as well the First-Year Seminar course and the full-time positions of Director of Placement and Transfer Services and three LAC representatives. When the grant ended in 2011, the College was able to financially retain the Center and the positions that were developed under the grant. Since that time CMCC has continued to keep a conscious eye on the success rates of General Studies students by increasing academic support offerings, such as tutoring and summer programming, and the advising assistance available in the Center by hiring another advisor and extending hours.
- The newly establish MCCS and University of Maine System block transfer agreement provides for a more seamless transfer process than previously in place.

Challenges:

- The College's English as a Second Language (ESL) program is within the General Studies program. The ESL program does not have a full-time faculty member or program coordinator. Students in ESL courses often attempt to register for introduction classes that require heavy reading and writing skills, such as psychology, sociology or communication, and they do not complete the courses successfully. The College must review the academic plan for ESL students in order to put the students on a pathway to success. A search process for a LAC representative who will focus on advising the local Somali population is underway.
- The College's First-Year seminar course is housed in the General Studies program, and General Studies is the only program that requires the course for graduation. The course is one-credit so there is difficulty in transferring the course and there has been turn-over in who coordinates the course. There are mixed feelings on campus about the value and impact of the course on student success.
- Due to the high enrollment in General Studies, it can be difficult for advisors to keep track of student career/educational goals, particularly since they change. In order to help address this issue, advisors utilized a shared notepad feature in Jenzabar and practice intrusive advising techniques.
- General Studies is the program that many of CMCC's most underprepared students enroll due to minimal entrance requirements. For this reason, attrition rates are a concern, but to address the issue LAC advisors actively engage with advisees and summer programming to improve upon development course needs has been developed. In addition, CMCC has chosen to use the position offered by the Navigating Successes grant from the John T. Gorman Foundation for a student navigator to focus on General Studies Students who have at least one development course need.
- CMCC has a seasoned Director of Placement and Transfer Services who works with General Studies students and who has built close working relationships with many of admissions offices at the four-year institutions CMCC students most often transfer to.

Planned Steps for Continuous Improvement:

- As mentioned earlier, the College is in the search process to hire a LAC Representative who will focus on working with the local Somali student population. In addition, the Navigating Success grant is being used to fund one more LAC representative to work with general studies students who are academically underprepared.
- Recognizing that there are mixed feelings about the value and impact of the First-Year Seminar course, a faculty member was asked to research the current state of course and to speak with others on campus on the role of the course, if the role is being met and how the course can be improved. The next step in the continuous improvement process is an assessment conference on what was learned from the research.
- Consider ways to promote the flexibility and vitality of the General Studies program to internal and external audiences.
- It has been found that the College needs a better tracking system to follow students who start in General Studies then change their major to another program at the College and then transfer and/or graduate from the second program. Data in this report shows how many General Studies students matriculate in a different program, but that is where the tracking of the General Studies relationship to the student ends. The student just described could be a General Studies success story that is not being recognized.
- Curriculum mapping of General Studies courses to demonstrate how they meet the six areas of the General Education Core curriculum is underway. The six areas are: critical thinking and scientific method of reasoning; communication; social responsibility; lifelong learning and self-growth skills; information literacy; and creative arts.
