Advanced Certificate



The Advanced Certificate in Education provides students with a program consisting of upper-level courses, beyond the associate's degree, required to work as a K-12 Ed Tech III or othere educational professional.

Students learn to:

- Observe, document, and assess young children, in partnership with families and professionals, to positively influence children's development
- Build and value diverse family and community relationships through knowledge of the important complex characteristics of children's families and communities
- Design developmentally effective approaches, theories, and techniques for classroom management
- Understand the increased well-being and positive learning impact that teachers can give students and families
- Design, implement and evaluate relevant, challenging and responsive curriculum, promoting comprehensive development and learning outcomes across cultures, including physical activity and nutrition

The advanced certificate is a way for current practioners to:

- Improve credentials
- Raise salaries
- Confront the issues of education professionals, early childhood educators, and teacher shortages in Maine
