

## Nursing Program: ATI TEAS® Admissions Assessment Exam

The ATI TEAS® Exam consists of four academic content areas. All applicants to the Nursing Program are required to complete the ATI TEAS® Exam prior to admission.

### Reading

**64 minutes • 47 Questions**

#### Key Ideas and Details (22Q)

- Summarize a complete text.
- Identify information from a graphic representation of information.
- Follow a given set of directions.
- Recognize events in a sequence. Identify topic, main idea, and supporting details.

#### Craft & Structure (14Q)

- Evaluate the authors point of view.
- Utilize text features.
- Interpret the meaning of words and phrases using context.
- Evaluate the author's purpose and point of view in a given text.

#### Integration of Knowledge & Ideas (11Q)

- Evaluate and integrate data from multiple sources in various formats including media.
- Compare and contrast themes from print and non-print sources.
- Evaluate an argument and its specific claims.
- Compare and contrast themes from print and non-print sources.
- Identify primary sources in various media.
- Evaluate an argument and its specific claims.

### Math

- Solve real world problems involving proportions.

#### Measurement and Data (9Q)

- Explain the relationship between two variables.

### Science

**63 minutes • 47 Questions**

#### Life & Physical Sciences (8Q)

- Explain characteristic properties of substances

#### Human Anatomy & Physiology (32Q)

- Describe the anatomy and physiology of the cardiovascular, integumentary, neuromuscular, reproductive, and skeletal systems.
- Describe the general anatomy and physiology of a human.

#### Scientific Reasoning (7Q)

- Analyze the design of a scientific investigation.
- Identify basic scientific measurements using laboratory tools.
- Analyze the design of a scientific investigation.

Students may retake the ATI TEAS® only after a three- day waiting period. A new ATI TEAS® Registration Form and payment must be submitted.

ATI TEAS® points are earned on the total exam score as follows:

- 100-80 = 10 points
- 79-75 = 5 points
- 74-70 = 2 point

ATI TEAS® is required for all applicants to be considered.
