

Transfer Articulation Agreement for Baccalaureate Degree
between
Central Maine Community College
and
Saint Joseph's College

Statement of Purpose

Central Maine Community College (CMCC) and Saint Joseph's College (SJC) have entered into this transfer articulation agreement. The purpose of this agreement is to facilitate student academic transfer and provide a smooth transition from a two-year community college to a university. It is recognized that this agreement shall describe the required program of study at CMCC for admission eligibility to SJC and the Baccalaureate Degree Program indicated.

Terms and Conditions of Academic Credit Transfer

To: Bachelor of Science in Health Administration - ONLINE
(SJC Academic Program/Degree)

From: Associate in Applied Science in Accounting
(CMCC Academic Program/Degree)

The evaluation and transfer of earned college credits shall follow state and federal education policies and institutional and academic program accreditation standards pertaining to undergraduate academic transfer. Current students and graduates who have earned degrees from Central Maine Community College shall be eligible for credit evaluation under the terms of this agreement.

Transfer students will be accorded the same standards and criteria for admission to a major degree sequence as SJC students. All applicants accepted to SJC Baccalaureate programs must fulfill the graduation requirements of the granting institution as identified in Appendices A, B & C.

Requirements for the Bachelor of Science in Health Administration from SJC: Remaining required course work is listed in Appendix C. Students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 to graduate and earn a C grade or better in all courses required for the major.

SJC Residency Requirement: At minimum, 30 credits of a student's baccalaureate course load must be completed at SJC.
